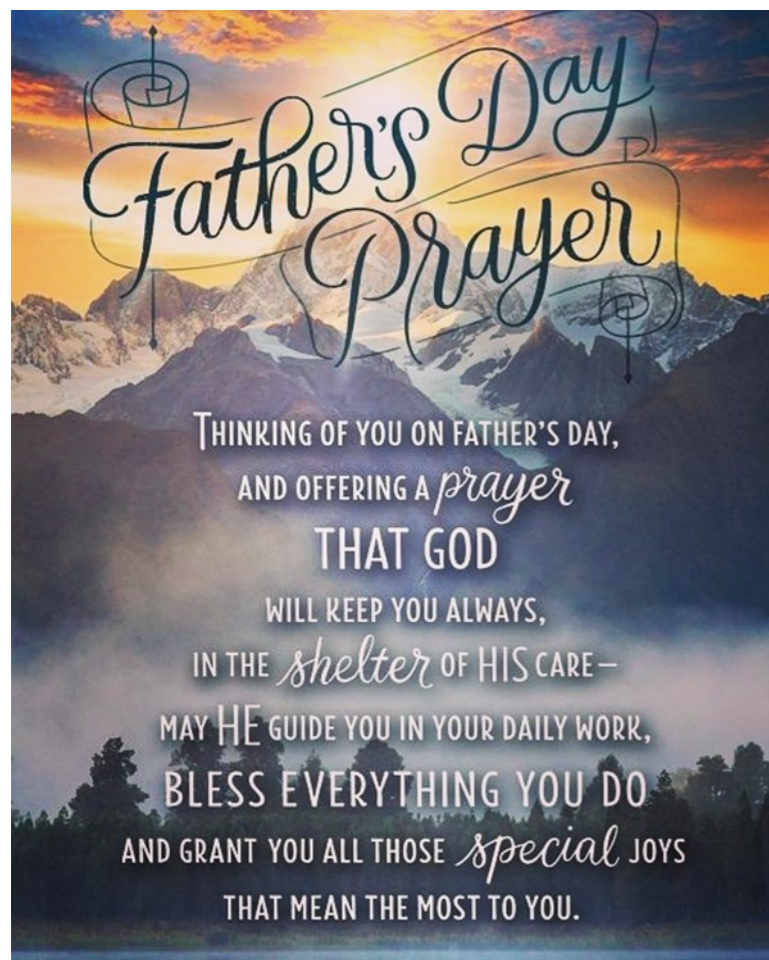

Bess's Experience

To quote Australia's first Saint, St Mary of the Cross Mackillop; 'Never see a need without doing something about it'. As a parent of three beautiful children, all of whom have had the privilege of attending both St Thomas Aquinas Primary School and St Columba's Catholic College, I understand the importance of learning about and living out our shared faith.

My children have grown and transitioned into young adults and remain aware of God's love. I am certain that, in their hearts, they know that the Holy Spirit is with them, to guide and support them through their actions and decisions. When asked to join the Catechist community at Mass a few years ago, I was promoted to consider my responsibility as a Christian woman, but also as a mum.

For many years I had ignored the calling as I was a busy, young, working mum and wife. I began teaching at Children's Liturgy during Sunday morning Mass. Throughout this experience, I prepared myself for the role of a Catechist by reading the scriptures and trying to understand God's message through the eyes of a child. This was an enriching experience; my faith grew stronger as I was challenged to understand and explain parables and stories to the children in a way that they could understand. I came to realise the simplistic and grounding foundations of my faith; that God loves unconditionally and calls each of us to work in his image and likeness. Although overwhelmed by the idea of teaching in the state schools, I listened to God's call and knew that, through his love and support, I could begin my Catechist journey.

The program is supportive, and each lesson is structured and easy to read and simple to follow. Catechism is a highly rewarding vocation. As Catechists, we share our faith with so many young people who would otherwise miss out on the joyful love and strength of Jesus, and the Christian community.
