REFUGEE FOOD DRIVE - LENTEN GIVING

House of Welcome is part of St Francis Social Services and provides services to support families seeking asylum. It receives support from many parishes throughout the Parramatta Diocese. Their Food-bank provides household necessities for asylum seekers with limited or no income. If you can make a donation of any items listed below, it would be greatly appreciated. No contribution is too small!

Requested Food Items: Canned Tuna in oil; Cooking oil; Tea & Coffee; Sweet biscuits; Honey/Jam; Basmati rice; Crushed Tomatoes with ring pull; Cereal; Raw lentils; Salt, pepper & spices; Instant noodles (chicken flavour); Sweet corn kernels; Tinned fruit; Flour; Sugar.

Requested Household Items: Deodorant; Cleaning products; Sanitary pads (not tampons); Body soap, body wash; Toothpaste/toothbrush; Shampoo/Conditioner; Toilet rolls; Dish cloths; Toilet cleaner; Dishwashing liquid; Laundry powder; Nappies (large sizes 5/6)

HELP NEEDED: Our **SRE's (Special Religious Educators)** are starting their scripture classes again in the 5 public local schools from next week. To be able to order the student activity books for 200+ students, we need financial help from our generous parishioners. The books cost about \$1,100 in total, of which we may get about a 1/3 from the public school parents, when we ask. I will place a Dutch tin at the back of the church for donations. We would also like more scripture teachers to come forward. We teach in Winmalee, Ellison & Winmalee High on Wednesdays, Faulconbridge & Springwood on Thursdays. 2023 COMBINED First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Sacramental Program - 6 Week preparation

We invite you and your child to be part of our 2023 First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Sacramental Program. This program will be conducted as one combined preparation in 2023 instead of two separate programs as both themes are connected. These sacraments will be in group sessions in a home or parish-based environment.

Age: Children in Year 3 or older in 2023, who have not yet received Reconciliation are invited to participate.

Meetings: Please come along to both Parent Meetings on Monday, 13th February and Thursday, 16th February (same week) 7pm at St Thomas Aquinas Church. (Not necessary for candidates to attend)

What do I bring along to the first meeting? Please bring with you a completed copy of the enrolment form (available to download via www.stachurchspringwood.org.au, hard copies at the back of the church or at the parish office) and also a copy of your child's baptism certificate.

The cost: \$40.00 per family (includes both sacraments). This covers all books required to complete both sacraments, certificates, and medal (medal - Holy Communion only). Payable via eftpos on the first parent evening.

Presentation of Candidates and Families at Mass: 18th February 5.00pm or 19th February 8.00am or 9.30am.

First Reconciliation will take place on Wednesday, 15th March at 7.00pm and Holy Communion on Friday, 24th March at 7.00pm (Please note new date)

WHY should I sign up for Mandatory Safeguarding Training?

- ✚ All people involved in parish life have a collective responsibility to ensure our parish life is safe and inclusive for all.
- ✚ We have a special responsibility to care for children and adults at risk.
- ✚ Religious organisations are now required by law to ensure their volunteers who are involved in ministries that may directly or indirectly come in contact with children and/or adults at risk are supported with Mandatory Safeguarding Training.
- ✚ This is a real opportunity to join with Bishop Vincent and work together at a Parish level to demonstrate that the Parish of St Thomas Aquinas has a zero tolerance of abuse in any form.

WHO should register for Mandatory Safeguarding Training?

- ≈ Are you involved in a ministry that works directly with children? (Acolytes, SRE Teachers, Children's Liturgy Helpers, Readers etc)
- ≈ Are you involved in a ministry that operates through liturgies and parish events?
- ≈ Are you involved in a ministry that may directly or indirectly come into contact with children and/or vulnerable adults?
- ≈ Are you curious and would like to know more about keeping parishes safe?
