At the heart of our Christian tradition is the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

During this week, we are led to contemplate Jesus was both a human person and also
God's chosen Son. The events we commemorate during Holy Week are central to our faith and our

Christian story.

As a community, we walk with Christ and with one another through the joyful entry into Jerusalem through to the rejection and agony of His suffering and death on the cross. We walk, passing through each event and moment, mindful that we will reach the promise of the resurrection at Easter and that this in turn will transform our lives.

Good Friday

Veneration of the Cross at STA:

- As you enter the church, please take a handmade cross available at the entrance and take a seat.
- We ask that **NO parishioners kiss the cross**.
- You are welcome to touch the cross with the homemade cross then place this cross into the basket, which will be set to the side of the wooden cross.
- Once you have done this, please take a wooden comfort cross from the table, positioned to the side and take back with you to your pew.

Easter Symbols in our Church

This Holy Thursday, you will see a single white rose on the altar while the altar still remains bare. In spite of the thorns, the white rose symbolises a life of purity, a sign of respect for the Eucharist, a sign of love and loyalty for our brothers and sisters.



On Good Friday, you will see a red rose alongside the white rose. The red rose is a symbol of Christ's blood and the sacrifice he made for us out of love.

On Easter Saturday, you will see 2 red roses and 4 white roses along with white banners and flowers back on our altar. We are celebrating new life and are sharing this day with our Lord as he rose today.

Three White Roses

Last weekend we had three white roses placed into the ashes on our altar. These roses symbolised Jesus as he is welcomed into Jerusalem. As Jesus' journey unfolds this Holy Week, the roses will wilt and die until the Sacred Paschal Triduum where our Lord was crucified, buried and risen. New white roses will appear out of the ashes, as a light of grace and blessing.

We acknowledge the Darug and Gundungarra people, the traditional custodians of this land and pay our respects to elders both past and present.

Glancing Thoughts

Easter Joy



The Psalm for Easter Sunday says, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Above all days, Easter is a day of joy.

But what is joy? The answer St. Francis gave to this question is famous. St. Francis said to his Brother Leo, "When we come to St. Mary of the Angels [our house], soaked by the rain and frozen by the cold, all soiled with mud and suffering from hunger, and we ring at the gate of the place and the brother porter comes and says angrily: 'Who are you?' And we say: 'We are two of your brothers.' And ... he does not open for us, but makes us stand outside in the snow and rain, cold and hungry, until night falls—then if we endure all those insults and cruel rebuffs patiently, ... oh, Brother Leo, ... perfect joy is there!"

Whatever we may think of St. Francis's explanation of perfect joy, Easter reminds us that Francis's kind of joy is not the end of the story. At Easter, we celebrate the other kind of joy, the kind each of us longs for, when every tear is wiped away, and there is no sorrow anymore—no more suffering from weather or hunger or hurtful human beings.

When we ourselves rise to meet our risen Lord, in that bright morning we will hear the Lord say, "Come away, beloved. The winter is past; the rain is gone, and the flowers return to the earth". In the loving union of that encounter, all the heartbrokenness of our lives will be redeemed. *That* will be perfect joy.

If all we had was the joy St. Francis describes, our courage might fail us in this life. Easter celebrates now the perfect joy waiting for us when we and all creation are reborn with our resurrected Lord into the everlasting love of God. This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Holy Land Collection - Good Friday 7th April 2023



The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday, April 7th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment, housing. Parishes, and orphanages. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Whilst life in the Holy Land is returning to some new sense of normality (as is the rest of the world) the Church and

people of the Holy Land are still struggling with reduced income due to fewer pilgrims and lower church attendance around the world. In 2022 Australian Catholics were extremely generous and we were able to send to the Holy Land \$1.4 million. The reality for the Holy Land mission is that they will continue to face challenges financial and spiritual and so we again ask Catholics around the world again to be as generous as possible, with their financial support as well as the spiritual support. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Good Friday.
