The Lord will make you a House

During my World Youth Day Pilgrimage in 2011 I was blessed to visit one of the most beautiful Churches in the World: La Sagrada Familia. This Cathedral is iconic due to its towering stature over Barcelona but also for its ongoing construction. Designed by architect Antonio Gaudi in the early 1880s the Church has been under construction since with no completion date in sight. When I visited it in 2011 my jaw dropped; it was tall, inviting, beautiful, and evoked a sense of mystery and wonder. The exterior and

interior detail was second to none: everywhere I looked raised my heart and soul to God. It truly is a sight to behold and I encourage you to add this Cathedral to your bucket list. Originally the Church wasn't supposed to be this large and ornate; the idea of a Church was first proposed by a small of group of devotees to St. Joseph as a means of drawing the faithful towards Our Lord after a hard days work. After the town received a large donation for the Cathedral's construction it was left in Gaudi's hands to design a Church appropriate for the community. Whilst some may criticise its grandeur or its construction period, its purpose remains the same: to draw the faithful to Our Lord in order to encounter the Divine. This purpose is consistent with every Church one enters - we seek an encounter with the living God.

We respect the Darug people and their elders both past and present, as the traditional custodians of this land on which we celebrate the Eucharist.

Our readings for the Fourth Sunday of Advent speak of God encountering his people. In our First Reading David voices his desire to the prophet Nathan to build a temple for the Lord 'Here I am living in a house of cedar, while the ark of God dwelt in a tent.' At that time the ark of the covenant was the tangible sign of God's presence amongst his people. Interestingly God does not take up David's offer to build a dwelling for him, rather He promises David that He will build a house for himself and all David's descendants. Fast forward to our Gospel and we see the foundations being built: The angel Gabriel appears to Our Lady and asks her to be the Mother of God. God does not seek to have a temporary building of brick and mortar, but an eternal dwelling fashioned through the human person allowing humanity to encounter God. Through Our Lady's supreme yes God takes on our humanity which is the new eternal temple; here God and Man are forever joined in Jesus Christ. God can no longer be perceived as a foreign impersonal deity, but one who is so near through our shared humanity.

Dear friends, with Christmas around the corner may we recognise the closeness of God in our lives through the Incarnation. We are able to encounter the living God through Him who become one of us. May we continue to draw strength from Him and be transformed by his grace.
