



The Devil and Temptation

I'm sure you're all familiar with the supernatural/horror genre in films. This particular theme often includes ghosts and demons usually linked with a variety of ancient and contemporary religions. Whilst not being the most pleasant of genres it has continued to generate millions from thrill seekers as it sparks curiosity about the metaphysical reality of creation. With movie actors and directors benefiting from their creative efforts, the understanding of the reality of the spiritual realm has been negatively affected. With 'Christian mythology' now deemed a subgenre in the



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supernatural/horror category the reality of the devil, demons and Hell have been reduced to fairy tale. I recall one instance speaking to a child who regularly attended Holy Mass; he was adamant that the demonic world and influence did not exist and that it was a useful ploy to ensure Christians followed God's laws. I was initially impressed at the child's sophisticated reasoning and logic, but then saddened at the unfortunate outcome: for many the devil is not real.

Our Gospel for this Sunday, albeit short, highlights the existence of the devil and his ultimate pursuit for human destruction. St. Mark doesn't say much other than 'Jesus was tempted by Satan' but one can naturally imagine what Our Lord endured during those forty days. One truth films present about the devil is his incredible power and relentless pursuit for destruction. Despite the reality of Jesus possessing the hypostatic union (Jesus is true God and true Man) the devil tempts him in ways that could further the mission of Our Lord. In St. Matthew and St. Luke's Gospel, Our Lord is offered bread, divine assistance and the world on condition he succumb to his passions and worship the devil. It seems almost too difficult of a temptation as Our Lord would have been exhausted from his fast in the desert and keen to start his mission. Yet our Lord shows courage: he reminds Satan that one worships God alone and that true happiness comes from him. The devil, an egotistical and disobedient fallen angel who once dwelt with God in Heaven, sought to bring all humanity to the kingdom of darkness by tempting the Son of God to also fall. Yet Christ proves his power is much greater. Christ, weakened by the harsh desert conditions, dispels all temptations of the devil and carries on with his mission. It is an incredible feat of Christ who shows his power over Satan.

Dear friends, as we begin our Lenten journey with increased prayer, penance and almsgiving whilst moving towards the holiest week in the liturgical year we are sure to face many temptations of the devil. We may be tempted to relinquish our penance and reduce this penitential season to begrudgingly following Catholic tradition. In those moments don't give up. Our Lord never sought the easy way out. Our Lord always faced adversity with faith and courage. Our Lord never stops loving each of us. So in those moments of temptation, yes the devil is powerful, but Christ is infinitely greater. I invite you to always rely on his grace and seek his assistance when faced with trials. If Our Lord was victorious in the desert, so can we in the desert of Lent so long as we lovingly trust in his grace and providence.


