

Kid's Corner






Gospel Mark 16:15-20

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them. 'Go out to the whole world: proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.

The Joy of the Ascension

Growing up I struggled to understand the Solemnity of the Ascension. This day marks the end of Jesus' earthly life as 'he was lifted up while they (Apostles) looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight.' Whilst I can only imagine Our Lord's desire to be united with the Godhead and the Communion of Saints in his Heavenly homeland, I can't help but feel humanity being short changed with his departure. Wouldn't it benefit the faithful more if he remained here on Earth? Does his absence allow us to be more effective disciples? Are we able to live out his mission to proclaim the Gospel with him in Heaven? If this event is a cause for joy, why does it seem that Christ has abandoned us by Ascending to Heaven? These questions arise when one first considers the mystery of the Ascension.

Throughout the Gospels Christ, on occasion, hints at his eventual departure from this world: During the Transfiguration St. Luke notes the topic of conversation between Jesus, Moses and Elijah - they speak of his departure which he is to accomplish in Jerusalem. This sentiment is made more frequently during Jesus' farewell discourse in John's Gospel as he frequently speaks of his departure. Like the above questions his words trouble the disciples as St. John relates they are filled with grief upon hearing of his eventual absence. It is clear that all parties concerned desire for Christ to remain here on Earth. However, note the promise coupled with Jesus' eventual departure: 'But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you.' Who is this Advocate? Catholic Doctrine understand that this Advocate is the same Holy Spirit who is part of the Holy Trinity - it is the same eternal Spirit who is the bond of love between the Father and the Son. With this in mind the Holy Spirit gives richer meaning to the Ascension. Yes, this day marks an end to Our Lord's earthly life but it also highlights Christ's eternal presence in the lives of his faithful. Through the Holy Spirit, the eternal bond of love between the Father and the Son, all the faithful now partake in this divine relationship; we are made co-heirs in the life of Christ. Jesus is not limited to one place in space and time, he is ever present in all who follow his ways; in short, the Ascension transcends Christ's presence in all the faithful. His promise in St. Matthew's Gospel rings true: "I am with you always, to the close of the age."

Dear friends, today's Solemnity of the Ascension is cause for great joy. On this day Christ ascends to the heights of Heaven and promises us the gift of the Holy Spirit. He does not abandon humanity as the Holy Spirit, the bond of love and third person of the Holy Trinity, will be the eternal and unyielding presence of God throughout human history. Additionally, the promised Spirit will also transform the lives of the faithful as God will work through them to proclaim his message of love and peace. May we all approach this day with joy and thanksgiving - Christ's Ascension marks our transformation.

Entrance Antiphon Ps 67: 33,35

You kingdoms of the earth, sing to God; praise the Lord, who ascends above the highest heavens, his majesty and might are in the skies, alleluia.

At the Mass during the Day

Entrance Antiphon Acts of the Apostles 1:11

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied. 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Responsorial Psalm Ps 46:2-3. 6-9. R. v.6

- (R.) God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.
- 1. All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. (R.)

This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.
