



write to you in not so sunny Rome in our pilgrimage coach departing the Eternal City and journeying towards Pietrelcina, the home of St. Pius of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio). It has been an incredible experience so far; our group has been enamoured by the great signs of faith in Rome - a foretaste of what is to come. Our pilgrimage group, composed of men and women around Australia and the United States, has a large contingent from Springwood: Philip and Joanne Saville, Kim Ellis, Helen Ferry, Margaret Hickey, Therese Lahiff and myself. For me Rome has rejuvenated my faith: the beautiful Churches decorated head to toe with every precious metal is a reminder of the deep faith and appreciation of the faithful; they were detached from the riches of the world and sought to offer to God all they could give. As you know I could rave on with my experience but I thought it best to hear from our parish pilgrims.

Kim has found the entire experience both inspiring and humbling. As one who devotes her time teaching the Catholic Faith in our local state schools she is hoping to bring this experience back to her family and students. Her favourite Church so far is St. Paul's outside the walls.

Margaret found Rome a little too crazy; the crowds alongside the traffic made it a difficult to fully appreciate the beauty of the eternal city. Nonetheless Rome still inspired her to enliven her faith. Her daughter Therese also found beauty in the chaos of Rome; the art found in the museums and Basilica's elevated her experience.

We respect the Darug people and their elders both past and present, as the traditional custodians of this land on which we celebrate the Eucharist.

Helen has found the pilgrimage so far amazing - the experience visiting the Churches and witnessing first hand the lives of the saints has inspired her to strengthen her faith.

Phil has loved every moment of the Pilgrimage. He has enjoyed learning the history of our faith especially its growth in Rome. He was also impressed with the life of St. Paul that he wandered around the basilica with his jaw on the ground.

Our last activity in Rome saw us visit the catacombs of Domitilla - an early Christian burial ground outside of Rome. When speaking to our pilgrims each of them expressed their gratitude and pride towards the gift of faith and hoped to deepen their love for God.
