Bulletin Reflection: 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel (Luke 18:1–8), Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who never gives up in pleading for justice. Her perseverance becomes a lesson for all who pray. God is not like the unjust judge: He is infinitely loving and attentive. Yet Jesus asks a searching question: "When the Son of Man comes." will he find faith on earth?"

We respect the Darug people and their elders both past and present, as the traditional custodians of this land on which we celebrate the Eucharist.

Prayer is not about convincing God to act—it is about shaping our hearts to trust Him. Perseverance in prayer trains the soul in faith, hope, and humility. Often, God's silence is an invitation to deeper communion, not neglect. We learn to pray not merely for what we want, but to remain united with the One who loves us.

This Sunday challenges us to pray with faith that endures. Like Moses lifting his hands in intercession and like the widow who refuses to lose heart, we are called to trust that our faithful God will bring justice and mercy in His time.



The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'
