

### Bulletin Reflection – 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent (Year A)

This final Sunday of Advent brings us to the quiet threshold of Christmas. Matthew's Gospel reveals the courageous faith of St Joseph—a man who listens deeply, trusts God's word, and welcomes the mystery of Emmanuel, "God-with-us." Joseph does not speak a single recorded word in Scripture; instead, his silence becomes a space where God's voice can be heard.

The Collect today recalls the angel's message to Mary, reminding us that the Incarnation begins with a simple "yes." God's greatest works unfold through ordinary people who are open to his grace.

As Christmas draws near, we are invited to imitate Mary and Joseph: to surrender fear, to welcome God's plan, and to allow Christ to be born anew in our homes, our parish, and our hearts.


In these final days of Advent, may we slow down, listen, and prepare a place where Christ can dwell bringing light, peace, and hope.

Then Isaiah said:

'Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men without trying the patience of my God, too? The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Emmanuel, a name which means "God-is-with-us".'

# Responsorial Psalm Ps 23:1-6. R. see w 7. 10

(R.) Let the Lord enter: he is king of glory.

# Second Reading Romans 1:1-7

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Jesus Christ, a descendant of David, is the Son of God.

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God, who, according to the human nature he took, was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

### Gospel Acclamation Matthew 1:23

Alleluia, alleluia! A virgin will give birth to a son; his name will be Emmanuel: God is with us. Alleluia!

### Gospel Matthew 1:18-24

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Jesus was born of Mary, the betrothed of Joseph, a son of David.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said. 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
